To participate you will need:

- ◆ A physician's prescription
- ◆ Be seizure-free for at least six months
- ◆ Meet state requirements for licensing

What is the procedure?

Pre-driving assessment: An evaluation will test your visual skills, reaction time, strength, range of motion, cognitive processing speed, memory, and basic driving knowledge.

On-the-road assessment: A certified driver rehabilitation specialist will observe your driving skills in our dual controlled vehicle. The driving portion may take place in a parking lot and/or light to heavy traffic settings, including the expressway, if appropriate. If adaptive equipment is recommended, you will have the opportunity to use it.

Training: Training may be recommended for those individuals requiring more practice using adaptive equipment or for those in need of learning safe driving strategies.

Documentation: A detailed report will be generated to make all parties involved aware of the recommendations.

Alternatives: For individuals who are not independent driving candidates, alternative transportation options will be reviewed.

Remember: Driving is a privilege, not a right. We do not guarantee that all persons completing the evaluations and training sessions will be able to obtain or continue to hold a Michigan driver's license. Only the Michigan Bureau of Motor Vehicles can issue and/or rescind driver's licenses.
