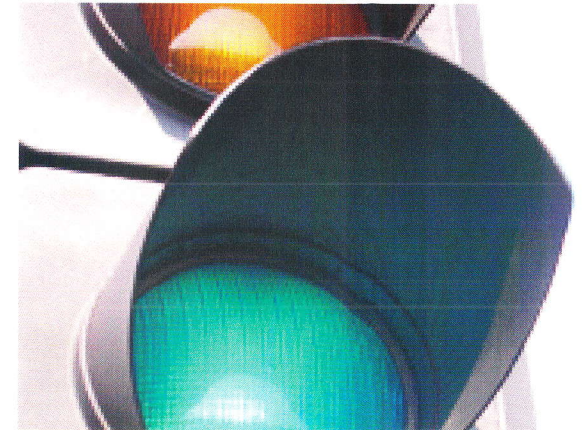

## A Team Approach

The DriveSafe Program offered through Drivers Rehabilitation Center of Michigan (DRCM) is designed to assist individuals in developing or regaining skills necessary for safe, independent personal transportation.

Our highly specialized staff is composed of occupational therapists, board certified driver rehabilitation specialists, certified driving instructors and special educators. Our team approach to the goal of independent driving offers individualized programs for persons of all ages.

DRCM receives referrals from insurance companies, physicians and hospitals, case managers and counselors, local court systems and concerned friends or family members. Our facility has been featured in The Detroit News and Free Press, The Observer & Eccentric Newspapers and Channel 2



## Who is eligible?

The DriveSafe Program can assist with various diagnoses such as:

- ◆ Neuromuscular Disorders ◆ Diabetes ◆ Autism
- ◆ Closed Head Injuries ◆ Learning Disabilities
- ◆ Aging ◆ ADD/ADHD ◆ Visual Impairments
- ◆ Spinal Cord Injuries ◆ Orthopedic Conditions
- ◆ Psychiatric Conditions ◆ Congenital Disabilities

## ***Our staff is committed to advising individuals in the following categories:***

### Experienced or aging drivers:

An evaluation can be provided to anyone experiencing a change in physical and/or cognitive abilities due to an injury, medical change or the natural aging process.

New drivers: Programs can be specifically designed for first time drivers to learn safe and defensive driving techniques.

Low vision: We will work with you and your vision specialist to assist you with alternative techniques to become proficient using visual aids or telescopic eye wear while driving.



Vehicle modifications: We will identify each client's specific needs to recommend the appropriate adaptive equipment in a car or in a van. We can assist with training, as well as, coordinating with equipment vendors and the Driver Assessment Bureau. Recommendations for transportation vans and functional conformance inspections can be provided.



To participate in the DriveSafe Program you will need:

- ◆ A physician's prescription
- ◆ Be seizure-free for at least six months
- ◆ Meet state requirements for licensing

## What is the procedure?

Pre-Driving Assessment: A comprehensive clinical evaluation will test your visual skills, reaction time, strength, range of motion, cognitive processing speed, memory and basic driving knowledge.

On-The-Road Assessment: A driver rehabilitation specialist will observe your driving skills in our dual controlled vehicle. The driving portion may take place in a parking lot, and/or light to heavy traffic settings, including the expressway. If adaptive equipment is recommended, you will have the opportunity to utilize it.

Training: Training may be recommended for those individuals requiring more practice using adaptive equipment or for those in need of learning safe driving strategies.

Documentation: A formal report will be generated to make all parties involved aware of our recommendations.

Alternatives: For individuals who are not independent driving candidates, alternative transportation counseling is available.
